The Future and Availability of Rockhounding in Oregon by Gary Buss

(Note: In this article Gary offers two suggestions for clubs to be more proactive in keeping rockhounding sites open and maintaining them for the future. The first suggestion is for the club to file a claim on a site. This excerpt describes his second suggestion. The full article can be found on the ALAA web site.)

There are many old sites that have been worked over the years and just sit there. The Forest Service has a plan called adoption. The Forest Service has neither the manpower nor the money to restore these old digs and are looking to partner with groups that care about restoring and maintaining some of these areas. This is not a "name it and claim it" game, it is a joint venture with the Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management to keep these areas open to the future of rockhounds. They do care about the future of rockhounding in Oregon.

How would it look? It can be as simple as a rock club that has a once-a-year field trip to a site they choose to adopt and have its own field day. Half the group digs and produces material, while the others refill old dig sites and pick up whatever trash they find. After a few hours, your people shift roles. In the meantime, maybe the barbeque is smelling pretty good for all at the end of the day. Adoption means that you as a club don't have to jump through all the hoops and rules and regulations of going the claim route—yet you maintain the site for your organization. There will always be old sites for you to look at and see if there is value for the future, or new areas that you would like to see as a future opportunity for your club.

I believe that adoption is the easiest and quickest way to maintain our past and to become a part of our future. This is a very different way to look at how we maintain our past and future in this hobby. Your children and theirs will be the beneficiaries of what we do now.
