

Field Trips

Dino Bones

One field trip I've enjoyed several times is put on by the Minnesota Mineral Club (https://minnesotamineralclub.org). Every year they travel to Glendive, MT, and hunt dinosaur bones on a badlands ranch for a day. You have to be a member of their club, and information on joining up is online (\$24 single; \$36 family). You don't need to live in MN. This year the Glendive trip is at the end of August and the first few days of September. You arrange your own transportation, and you can stay at the motel they use or find a place on your own. I've found small bones and a very nice dinosaur vertebra on this ranch, and there's also triceratops parts, turtle shell, huge amounts of petrified wood, etc. The strata at the ranch lies just before and after the KT extinction. T. rex bones can be found—don't hold your breath—but the ranch owner lays claim to all those, no matter who finds them.

Fossils from this ranch are in the Museum of the Rockies and other museums. There's a fee for hunting on the ranch, something like \$40 for the day, as I recall. Might be higher now. On other days during the trip the club members can look for Montana agates in the Yellowstone River or do what they want. The club also has other US field trips listed on their web site. (They like to travel!) The reason I'm letting you know about this now is that you have to register for this Glendive trip in advance—but registration has not opened yet.

Also, I know this area well and if you want to stay longer than the MMC trip I can tell you where to find petrified leaves, scaphite fossils, belemnite fossils, etc. There are lots of shale and sandstone beds in the area (Pierre shale, Fox Hills, Hell Creek) with gazillions of shell fossils. Glendive also has a nice badlands park and museum. Contact me if you have questions. - Tom Noe

Haunted Ridge

We are planning a trip to dig Missouri druzy quartz and geodes next month. We are leaving Saturday evening May 20th, digging at Haunted Ridge Sunday May 21st and digging in Keokuk Monday May 22nd. This is not organized by the club, but we wanted everyone to have the opportunity to meet up with club members if they wish. I know of one other family from the club that is going and we are all making our own arrangements.

Dennis and I will leave on Saturday evening and stop for the night in Effingham, Illinois. We plan to head out early Sunday and get to Haunted Ridge around 10:30 am and spend the day digging there. We will spend Sunday night in Keokuk, Iowa (about 4 hours from Haunted Ridge) and dig geodes on Monday – the mine location has not been decided yet.

We love to see members of the club and welcome anyone who wants to join us to make their plans. At this time Haunted Ridge charges \$30 per 5 gallon bucket of material you want to keep. You must bring your own tools and buckets, they do have buckets for sale but it would be less expensive to bring your own. Check with large grocery stores in their deli/bakery as some of the products they use come in these buckets and sometimes they give them away or sell at a good price.

We will be at the April meeting if anyone has any questions.
