Tom McLaughlin is in charge of the displays. I know most of you have displays, so let Tom know how many you will bring. If you need a case, we do have several flat cases that you can fill with your items, BUT YOU MUST LET US KNOW. They are in storage and will have to be picked up. Can you come out and get one?

We will need help on Thursday before the show, to pick up things from the storage. That evening we need help with the marking for the booths. We need workers early Friday morning (about \$30) to cover the display, silent auction and demonstrators' tables. Remember, this is your show, and the profit from it helps to pay for any bus field trips we have and other expenses we will have during the year. So plan on helping... everyone is important.

First, though, our picnic will be held August 23, at the Clay Township Park, with a meeting at 12:30, followed by the potluck at 1:00 pm. (South Bend time). The park is west of 31 on Laurel Road, between Auten Road and Darden Road immediately north of Healthwin Hospital. The chicken, punch, ice & rolls will be furnished. If you
