During this trip we maybe adding additional side trips. Let Ross know if



Thank you to the Catawba Valley. Gem and Mineral Club, Inc. for hosting the AFMS/EFMLS Convention in Hickory, North Carolina. The Convention was a great success with many vendors, a wonderful kids area, one beautiful competitive exhibit (submitted by a first time exhibitor who earned a score high enough to earn a trophy) as well as several other exhibits.
